Construction begins on the church's first building, at 211 Main Street. Construction was completed in 1933. (Now Johnson's Auto Glass)

1956

After years of growth, the church finished construction on its current building at 701 E Capitol Avenue.

1973



History 1

1923

A small group of people, were inspired to plant Ellensburg's first Pentacostal church. Originally, these families began meeting in Mrs. Edmondson's living room.

As the church grew, they had to find a larger place to gather. First moving to the Lincoln School. Eventually the church adopted the name Glad Tidings Mission and moved again. First to the corner of 3rd and Pearl, then to the Odd Fellows Hall.

1950's

The church changed its name to Assembly of God.

As the church continued to grow, they broke ground on a new building on the corner of Capitol and Walnut, where the church is still located today



1930's

The church built its first building on the corner of Main and Washington (now Johnson's Auto Glass).

The church changed its name to Bethany Pentacostal Church.



The church established the parsonage.

The church changed its name to, First Assembly of God Church Incorporated.

The church established the Chi Alpha ministry at Central Washington University, and purchased the Chi Alpha house.

2000's

In 2004, the church changed its name to Family Christian Center.



1970's

The church celebrated God's blessing and its 50th anniversary, by burning the mortgage.
